Participated in Junior Medical Officer Quality and Safety Committee where our key focus for the year was on prevention of falls through demonstrating the need for greater adherence to therapeutic guidelines in relation to nighttime sedation. Whilst this project is currently in its 2nd PDSA cycle we estimate that the impact of our intervention has prevented a minimum of 12 falls in the hospital this year.
